Planning, high visibility keep new Pi Kapp house busy

It has been just over a

year since we purchased our chapter house at NSU, and what an active year it was! The house has given the undergraduate chapter a place to congregate and conduct meetings. It is in such a visible location that Pi Kappa Phi gets much attention around the community.

During our annual meeting at Homecoming, Housing Corporation officers were elected for the upcoming year. They are: Robert

Broadwell, President; Scott Roach, Vice President; George Etheredge, Treasurer; and Robert Wagnon, Secretary.

From a maintenance perspective, we added a new deck on the back of the house, and it has really been a nice addition when visitors are there. It's a great place to barbeque and hang out. Recently, much needed insulation was added to the attic. This should help with reducing the cost of utilities. Also, Robert Wagnon donated a Foose Ball table. Along with the pool table, it creates a fun atmosphere. Thank you, Robert! At Homecoming, the alumni showed the college guys how the game is played!


Six guys have signed leases to live in the house for the spring semester. They are excited to live in the house as new rent incentives have been implemented. The monthly rental fee is \$275 per month. However, if the rent is paid on or before the first day of the month, the rent is \$250. Any rent received after the fifth day of the month is \$300. I am excited about the tenants, as they are all the type of individuals that will keep the house clean and presentable for visitors.

House Financial Update

Finally, I want to update everyone with some financial information regarding the house. With interest rates being low, the Housing Corporation Board of Directors wants to refinance the house very soon.

Currently, we have an \$80,000 adjustable rate mortgage at City Bank in Natchitoches that has a 7% floor and a 12% ceiling. We are currently at the 7% floor.

Pi Kappa Phi National has a \$40,000 second mortgage on the

house at a rate of 8%, and the loan has a five-year balloon.

We are trying to get a new appraisal on the house in the \$140,000 range. We have been told this will not be a problem. Sabine State Bank of Many will loan us 80% of the appraised value at 6.25% on a

10-year fixed-rate mortgage. Combined with some of the existing funds in the Housing Corporation, the proceeds from the new loan will allow us to completely pay off the \$40,000 second mortgage to Pi Kapp National.

Once these transactions have been completed, the Housing Corporation should have \$5,000 to \$6,000 remaining in the bank. Of course, we are still taking any \$20+/month Alumni donations via bank draft, which will be applied to pay off principle on the loan. At this point, only about 15 Alumni are making this monthly donation. I am hoping that we can at least double that amount. 
There is no doubt in my mind that the purchase of the chapter house has been a major benefit to the local chapter and alumni, but also it has been a very wise investment. I am very hopeful the Housing Corporation can completely pay of the house before ten years has elapsed. At that point, we will own a very valuable piece of property in a prime location in Natchitoches.

For those of you that have not had the opportunity to see **YOUR** house, I hope you can make it to Rose Ball in February. It will be a good opportunity to see the house and lots of old friends.


