### Pi Kapp brothers stay busy improving Chapter House

It has been a very busy year at Beta Omicron, and a lot has been happening at the Chapter House. The undergraduates implemented a plan that will keep the house full of tenants each semester. Obviously, this is important

for cash flow and paying our bills.

As most of you should be aware, the Housing Corporation refinanced the house last year, on a 10-year note. Interest rates continued to go down, so again, we refinanced. The net effect was that we kept the note the same, but reduced our payment term by three months. We now have approximately 8.5 years remaining before the house is paid off! Special thanks to Scott Roach and Robert Wagnon for getting this job done!

Several improvements have been completed at the chapter house this year. Blown insulation was put in the attic to help reduce utilities. In certain areas of the attic, there was virtually no insulation, and now, you can "feel" the difference in the house. We purchased a new couch, as normal wear and tear took its toll on one of the old ones. The carpet in the game room side of the house was removed, and the existing concrete was exposed. After seeking a recommendation from alumni Bruce Kinder at Kinder Paint Company in Alexandria, he recommended a method to stain the concrete and apply a sealer. Bruce donated the materials, and this job has been completed. It will really help to keep this room clean. There is

a pool table in there with couches, a color T.V., and a coke machine. Inevitably, there will be spills with normal activities, and carpet is probably not a good idea here. Thanks, Bruce!

The biggest capital improvement was the new faux brick patio in the back yard. The yard had become a virtual mud hole during wet periods, and the mosquitoes had rendered the yard unusable much of the time. We took bids on a 500-square-foot slab, and the housing corporation awarded the job to a local contractor. The patio has a Flagstone pattern, and along with the deck we added last year, it really looks great! We did some landscaping, and it makes the back yard very presentable. I believe this was a great investment. The guys can have sorority exchanges there, and they have added some "tiki" lanterns to promote a romantic effect. HA! (Priorities haven't changed much over the years).

The undergraduates have worked hard on enhancing the house as well. They have done painting, inside and out, and have done a number of repairs to the house. The pool table was re-felted at their expense, and we have added expanded cable so they can watch football games on a lot of channels. This room should be a great place for them to "hang out".

The housing corporation had another active year, and we certainly have other things we would like to do. It is a matter of funding, so any help in this area will be greatly appreciated.

I hope to see everyone at homecoming. Thanks for all your help!

### **Financial Advisor Report**

Over the summer I volunteered to become the financial advisor for the chapter. I have met twice over the summer with the Archon, Vice-Archon and Treasurer to help them work up the budget for the upcoming fall semester. The

fall budget will be presented to the members for approval at their first meeting.

While doing this budget, it gave me an insight of just what is involved financially with the chapter. I was amazed of what it cost this chapter to operate. Just to give you an idea of what it takes to operate, here are the figures from their FALL SEMESTER 2003 proposed budget:

The income for the chapter comes from dues (\$17,000), fundraisers (\$3,000), and donations from alumni (\$1,000). The biggest problem the chapter faces here is the collection of their dues from the members. Currently, there is over \$3,000 due the chapter in past due amounts. This is not good. To help in the collection of these delinquent dues, the chapter has contracted Omega Financial to collect all future dues, and all past due amounts owed to the chapter. They charge a little over 4% on the collected amount. Over the past thirty days, Omega has been able to collect a portion of the past due amounts. I think contracting Omega Financial is a step in the right direction, and will help eliminate a large past due amount in the future.

I hope this gives the alumni a little better idea of what it takes financially to operate as a chapter. It is a pleasure and a lot of fun to work with these young men, and I look forward to working with these men in the future. If you have a chance or a desire to volunteer and work with these young men, do it. It's a blast!

### B.O's ritual team to host initiation of 1956 pledge during reunion weekend Oct. 24-25

#### Billie Roy Cook, Pledge Emeritus, becomes a bona fide Brother

Charter members of B.O.Chapter, along with other chapter alumni representing their 1956–1962 collegiate years at NSU, will host the group's bi-annual reunion to rekindle friendships and recall fond memories Oct 24-25 in Natchitoches. Ironically, their long-term friendships and frequent communications via the Internet have included a 1956 Freshman Pledge, neophyte Billie Roy Cook. "Pledge Cook" was a carry-forward from the local fraternity, Phi Kappa Nu.

B.O. Charter Members, Mike Murphy (No. 5), Charles Bice (No. 8), Bill Plunkett (No. 3), John Wheat (No. 29), and Robert Kelley (No. 17), all reunion coordinators, told us that during the alumni group's previous reunion in 2001, they voted to

end Cook's overextended tenure as a Pledge and bring him into the alumni brotherhood ranks. Cook is a retired Army Major with two tours in Vietnam as a member of the 101st Airborne "Screaming Eagles" and he is also a member of the NSU Baseball Hall of Fame.

Jack McCain, owner of McCain's Auto Supply in Natchitoches, was the first Archon of this Chapter in 1956. We understand that there was a protracted and humorous Internet dialogue about the indignities of their 50's "informal initiations," and whether Pledge Cook should be "tested" or should he be inducted into the fraternity through the Ritual's formal rites. The Brothers from the "collegiate years" decided, tongue-incheck, to forego the informal initiation on

the basis that Cook's two tours of duty in Vietnam exhibited the supreme test.

The Ritual Team of Beta Omicron Chapter, along with the Alumni Chapter Board, plan to bestow the initiation Ritual honors, on Friday evening, October 24, 2003, on Bill Cook, who has, perhaps, held one of the longest tenures as a pledge in the history of Pi Kappa Phi. This historic event will coincide with NSU's Homecoming weekend.

A Friday night dinner is planned for the early arrivals. A Saturday morning registration and get-together will be held at the Holiday Inn Express, and Saturday evening will culminate the weekend with a dinner-banquet at the downtown Merci Beaucoup Restaurant.
